



Miami's Top Spots

Get a look at some of Miami's top hotels.

Get a look at some of Miami's top hotels: the trendy Shelborne in the heart of South Beach, the swanky Biltmore in the garden city of Coral Gables and the towering Trump International Beach Resort in Sunny Isles.

1. The Biltmore Miami Hotel



Built in 1926, the Biltmore Hotel in Coral Gables has been designated a National Historic Landmark. The 150-acre property isn't on the water, but it does have a 22,000-square-foot swimming pool – the largest in the continental United States. Foodies take note -- the Biltmore is also the only hotel in North America with its own recreational culinary school.

Pros: Big rooms, golf course, huge pool, culinary academy

Cons: Not beachfront, located outside the city in Coral Gables

2. Shelborne South Beach



This Art Deco hotel in Miami's trendy South Beach has the advantage of being located right on historic Collins Avenue. With direct beach access and 2 hot spot restaurants, the Shelborne won't disappoint.

Pros: Direct access to the beach, located right in South Beach on Collins Avenue

Cons: Not many activities for kids

3. Trump International Resort



The towering Trump International Beach Resort, located in nearby Sunny Isles, FL, has plenty to offer the whole family. The kids' club at the hotel is completely free, and the rooms all have small kitchenettes. Take in the breathtaking ocean views, relax by one of 2 pools or head straight to the beach.

Pros: Right on the beach, great pools, free kids program

Cons: Located outside Miami in Sunny Isles, not a lot of other dining options nearby
